Our team has also been progressing a manuscript based on the first Ngā Pī Ka Rere survey (undertaken in 2021), along with co-authors Kathryn McRae and Susanna Finlay-Smits. We look forward to revisiting early career experiences and perspectives in BioHeritage through a second survey planned for later this year.
